Course Evaluations from the University of Kansas:

Note that I break up the data, first, according to the class taught; thus, I provide four headings: Reason and Argument (or Critical Thinking), Introduction to Symbolic Logic, Introduction to Philosophy, and Introduction to Social and Political Philosophy. Second, under each heading are tables corresponding to a specific semester, each of which represents how students rated me, either as an instructor or discussion leader, for all the classes I taught that semester combined. By assigning a weight to each rating (e.g. 5 for Excellent, 4 for Above Average, etc.), a mean average can be assigned to my overall performance for each semester. Students who filled out evaluations, but declined to rate the course or my teaching performance, were not figured in calculating the mean. Finally, notice that, for each kind of course (except for Introduction to Social and Political Philosophy), I provide a table summing all the ratings, thereby allowing me to calculate a rating of my overall performance for a kind of course. I do not provide a table of my overall performance for Introduction to Social and Political ot Social and Political Philosophy, since I only have one table for it.
